


Fig.1 Relative output current vs.




Fig.4 Relative output current vs. distance (II)




Fig.2 Forward current falloff




Fig.5 Power dissipation / collector power dissipation vs. ambient temperature




Fig.3 Forward current vs. forward voltage





Fig.6 Relative output vs. ambient




Fig.7 Collector current vs. forward current




Fig.10 Output characteristics




Fig.8 Response time vs. collector current





Fig.9 Dark current vs. ambient temperature
